Bread and Cheese cupboard Cwpwrdd Bara Caws

£4650

Welsh oak and pine food cupboard, decorated with mahogany, holly and bog oak inlay, bone key escutcheons, decorative fret work ventilation panels to the top doors and original brass handles.

This style of inlay with the pattern of diamonds and circles is associated with furniture made by the Williams family from Talwrn in Anglesey who were cabinet makers during the late 18th and early 19th century.

2 Lovespoon Llwy garu

A beautiful Welsh lovespoon made from sycamore with a good patination and extravagant chip carved decoration and a single heart.

3 Oak chest with drawers Cist dderw gyda droriau

This is a wonderful Welsh oak chest with four drawers, which is sometimes known as a "mule chest", beautifully made from solid oak throughout with bog oak and holly chequer inlay between the panels. The interior has the original candle box and an unusual wooden mechanism for locking the drawers.

4 Windsor chair Cadair Windsor

A very good late 18th century English comb back Windsor chair.

This wonderful chair has a well shaped top rail and a bold pierced "Country Chippendle" style back splat, horse-shoe shaped arm with turned supports, a saddle-seat and turned legs. Made from ash and elm and still retains much of the original green and later black paint.

5 Corner cupboard Cwpwrdd cornel

A fine Welsh oak standing corner cupboard made from beautifully figured quarter sawn timber, which has a wonderful colour and with contrasting bog-oak escutcheons.

6 Eisteddfod chair Cadair Eisteddfodol

A magnificent oak Eisteddfod chair, made for the Machynlleth Eisteddfod of 1898. Maglona refers to a Roman fort near Machynlleth. The chair was probably made by Demetrius Owen of Llanbryn-mair and won by Penllyn (Rev W E Jones) of Colwyn.

This chair (along with a photo of Penllyn) is illustrated in "The Bardic chair —Y Gadair Farddol" by Richard Bebb & Sioned Williams, Saer Books 2009.

7 Centre table Bwrdd i ganol ystafell

A 17th century oak centre table, which has a cleated top, channel moulded frieze and tall turned legs with H-stretcher.

A small chest made entirely from figured and burn elm, including the base boards and interior candle box.

A small simple pine bench of boarded construction, with a wonderful historic original blue with later green and black painted finish.


10 Cricket table Bwrdd criced

A classic Welsh pine two-tier cricket table with an elegant "cupids-bow" shaping to the top and shelf friezes. It has a dry scrubbed top and original painted finish to the legs and shelf.

A magnificent four step Welsh elm spoon rack, with a beautifully shaped top, front, sides and back. Together with a collection of 24 original hand-carved sycamore "Cawl" spoons.

12 Scottish spoon box Blwch llwyiau o'r Alban

A mahogany and pine hanging spoon box with a beautifully decorated front panel including a pierced Celtic knot, pin-wheels and hearts. Used for storing horn spoons. Impressed with the name A.Lindsay, who was possibly the maker.

A large Welsh wool sampler with good bright colours and interesting motifs including musicians, acrobats on horse back and a large ship. In original frame. By Dinah Davies, Llwyn Ysgaw and dated 1867.

A Dinah Davies is recorded in 1861 living at Llwyn Ysgaw, Mwnt, Cardiganshire.


19 Side Chair Cadair ochr
